ORDER PURSUANT TO 11 U.S.C. § 327(e) AND FED. R. BANKR. P. 2014 AUTHORIZING RETENTION AND EMPLOYMENT OF LOWE, FELL & SKOGG, LLC AS SPECIAL COUNSEL TO THE DEBTORS, *NUNC PRO TUNC* TO THE COMMENCEMENT DATE

Upon the Application, dated July 21, 2009 (the "Application"), of Motors

Liquidation Company (f/k/a General Motors Corporation) and its affiliated debtors, as debtors in possession (collectively, the "Debtors"), pursuant to section 327(e) of title 11, United States

Code ("Bankruptcy Code") and Rule 2014 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure

("Bankruptcy Rules") for entry of an order authorizing the retention and employment of Lowe,

Fell & Skogg, LLC ("LFS") as special counsel to the Debtors, *nunc pro tunc* to the

Commencement Date, all as more fully described in the Application; and due and proper notice

of the Application having been provided, and it appearing that no other or further notice need be

provided; and upon the Supplemental Declaration of Henry I. Lowe, dated July 31, 2009 (the

"Lowe Supplemental Declaration"); and the Court having found and determined that the relief sought in the Application is in the best interests of the Debtors, their estates and creditors, and all parties in interest and that the legal and factual bases set forth in the Application establish just

cause for the relief granted herein; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefor, it is

ORDERED that the Application is granted as provided herein; and it is further ORDERED that pursuant to section 327(e) of the Bankruptcy Code, the Debtors are authorized to employ and retain LFS as special counsel to the Debtors on the terms set forth in the Application and this Order, effective *nunc pro tunc* to the Commencement Date, for the Representative Matters identified in the Application and in accordance with LFS's Fixed Fee Agreements; and it is further

ORDERED that LFS shall apply for compensation and reimbursement of expenses in accordance with the procedures set forth in sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code, applicable Bankruptcy Rules, the Local Rules and orders of the Court, guidelines established by the U.S. Trustee, and such other procedures as may be fixed by order of this Court; and it is further

ORDERED that LFS's retention by the Debtors is for the period from June 1, 2009 through July 10, 2009, and the Debtors reserve their right to retain LFS pursuant to a new engagement agreement and retention application; and it is further

ORDERED that LFS shall notify in writing this Court, the Debtors, the U.S.

Trustee, and any official committee of any change in billing rates charged by LFS for services

rendered; and it is further

ORDERED, that to the extent this Order is inconsistent with the Representative

Matters, this Order shall govern; and it is further

ORDERED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction to hear and determine all

matters arising from or related to this Order.
